Transcripts – Official transcripts should be sent to the NCAA after completion of the 6th HS semester (end of Junior year). Official, final transcripts must also be sent at the conclusion of senior year and must have all grades and show proof of graduation.

*Official transcripts from each individual high school attended must be sent to the Eligibility Center.

Transcripts must come directly from the high school in a sealed envelope or submitted electronically from the high school via a certified transcript service (i.e. Parchment.com, etc.) or through the High School Portal.

► **Amateurism Certification** – At the time of registration students must answer questions on their Eligibility Account to determine amateurism. Review your amateurism questionnaire responses and request final amateurism certification on or after April 1.

► **Admissions Application:** The SDSU Admissions application can be accessed at www.CSUmentor.edu. The Fall 2017 Undergraduate application is available from October 1st- November 30th. Please have your transcript(s) with you when you fill out the application. Notices of Admission will be sent to students between February and March 2016.

* If you are unable to complete the Fall 2017 application in the normal application period (10/1-11/30), application access will need to be granted to you individually. Please coordinate with the Student-Athlete Services Coordinator for access.

Transcripts –San Diego State University requires that all students send two official transcripts to SDSU; one official transcript with grades from 9th grade to 12th grade (including 7th semester), and one official transcript with a graduation date and all final grades from senior year.

*Official transcripts from each individual high school attended must be sent to the SDSU Office of Admissions. Transcripts must come directly from the high school in a sealed envelope or sent electronically from the high school through a certified transcript service (i.e. Parchment.com, etc.). If sending transcripts by mail, please send your transcripts to both your coaching staff, and SDSU.

► **Placement Exams- Entry Level Mathematics (ELM) English Placement Test (EPT)**

ELM and EPT EXAMS must be taken the following apply to you:

- You did not score a minimum of 23 Math and/or 22 English on the ACT.
- You did not score a minimum of 550 Math and/or 500 Critical Thinking on the SAT (SAT exams prior to March 2016) **Exemptions based on SAT exams taken after March 2016 are TBD**
- You are a transfer student and do not meet the SAT/ACT scores and have *not* completed a college course that satisfies CSU GE requirement in Quantitative Reasoning and/or English Composition.
- You have taken the Calculus AB, Calculus BC or Statistics Advanced Placement (AP) exam and scored a 3 or higher (ELM exempt)
- You have taken the Language & Composition or Composition & Literature AP exam and scored a 3 or higher (EPT exempt)

California residents must take the test(s) no later than the first Saturday in May and may be taken at any CSU campus throughout CA. Out of State and international students may take the test(s) in their home state or country, register for the test(s) by selecting the Out of State Test Center during registration.

The out-of-state tests are scheduled for the second week of every month except May, which is the first week of the month. To register for an out-of-state test, you must register by the 15th of the month before testing will take place. After registration, student-athletes will be contacted at least two weeks prior to test date with location and time information.
